## Accountability of climate planning in the context of inequality and economic growth in developing cities



### Background

- Developing countries contribute limited amounts of GHG emissions compared to developed countries, and therefore commit to minimal mitigation efforts.
- However, lack of detailed inventories can lead to lack of accountability of the GHG emissions of higher income groups.
- In addition, the prioritization of economic growth goals opens planning paths into high carbon futures, and limits mitigation opportunities to economically relevant options.

### Methods

- Literature review, including laws, planning documents etc. and qualitative analysis
- Statistical analysis of inventory, consumption and population data
- Survey of household emission data
- Expert interviews and qualitative analysis
