

Information sheet on the study orientation procedures for undergraduate degree programmes

All higher education institutions in Baden-Württemberg require proof of participation at an orientation procedure when you apply for a place on a degree programme. This is intended to help prospective students choose the right degree programme for them and thus prevent wrong decisions and subsequent withdrawal from studies.

All applicants for an undergraduate degree programme must take part in a study orientation procedure.

It is optional to include the proof of participation with your application documents; however, it must be submitted at the latest by the time of enrolment. For this, please print out the confirmation of participation which is made available to you at the end of the (online) tests. At the time of application, participation in the orientation procedure must not date back more than two years.
